Entries

Art. 1. **An entrance fee of .50 cents will be charged on all entries.**

Art. 3. Articles to the Floral Hall by 11:30 Tuesday July 27 **except Baked Goods and Pies**  
Baked Goods in place by 9:30 Friday July 30 Pies in place by 12:00 Friday July 30

Art. 8. A “professional” is one who follows painting and drawing as a business or for profit.

Art. 9. All articles must be entered in person.

Art. 16. Hereafter blue will indicate first premium: red, second. NO premiums will be given for Best of Class.

Art. 17. The society agrees to pay in full all premiums awarded unless otherwise provided. If funds are not sufficient all awards will be prorated.

Art. 18. Competition is open to residents of Iowa and adjoining states only and all exhibits must be accompanied by their own owners or authorized representatives.  
All articles must be entered in owner’s name.

Art. 21. No premiums will be paid on exhibits that have won first place in the last 5 years. Premiums not called for within two months will be considered as donated to the society.

Art. 22. There will be no refund on entry fees.

Art. 23. Premium money may be picked up in Floral Hall the time of release.

**If articles are not picked up during release time you forfeit premium and the item becomes property of Floral Hall.**

Loss or Damage

The Board of Directors will use diligence to ensure the safety of articles after arrival and arrangement but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibitors must give personal attention to their property and immediately preceding the close of the fair take charge of the same.

Enter ALL items Monday July 26 at 3:00 to 6:00 PM or Tuesday July 27 at 8 to 11:00 AM.

**ALL ITEMS IN PLACE BY 11:30 Tuesday except Baked Goods in place by 9:30 AM Friday July 30 Pies in place by 12:00 pm Friday July 30 .**

Premiums given according to Judges’ discretion.

There will be no refunds.

Nothing entered except cataloged. No premiums allowed on articles purchased or borrowed. Exhibitors may mail their entries to before entry day and pick up their tags and pay the entry fee July 26 3:00- 6:00 PM or July 27 8:00-11:00 AM in Floral Hall.

Exhibitors must have their entries tagged before presenting them for entry.

**Items entered for premiums will be released 9-11AM Saturday July 31**

**Items released early forfeit premium. Items not picked up by 11:00 AM. will be disposed and premiums will go back to fair board.**

Superintendent or judge will reserve the right to refuse any article that has previously won a blue ribbon in the last 5 years.

## Division F – Flowers

**Louisa County Master Gardeners Fair Committee Judging Tuesday  
July 2, 12:30 P.M.**

1. The purpose of this flower show is for the education and enjoyment of all who view the show as well as the exhibitors.
2. This division is open to amateurs only. A professional is defined as one who earns their livelihood from their skills.
3. All entries accepted Thursday July 19 between 8:00 -10:30 AM and in place by 11:30 AM 4.
4. People from surrounding communities may send in entries early and pick up tag on entry day.
5. Flowers must be in on time. No late entries will be accepted.
6. Only one entry per person in each category. All entries are eligible in only one class. One entry per person for each category and no more than 20 entries per household.

7. The exhibitor must be present to register entries or present contact information, in case of questions, If questions can not be answered, entry will be denied.
8. Best of Class is ribbon only
9. For Best of Class and Best of Show awards, preference will be given to those entries that have (where indicated) the name/variety of the plant listed.

**Second Premium = \$1.50**

**10. Helpful Hints for Exhibitors**

11. List name/variety on entry tag where indicated
12. Place specimens in clear uncolored clean glass containers where indicated.
13. Remove any foliage that is going to be under water.
14. Remove or trim outer petals and foliage that show insect or weather damage.
15. Look for uniformity in size of bloom.
16. Do not choose spent or faded flowers, instead choose fresh flowers.
17. Use soft make-up brush to clean up debris on blooms or plants.
18. Use supports that do not show for holding stems of large flowers like sunflowers in displays or arrangements.
19. Do not allow mechanics of any kind, such as oasis, filler, frogs, etc. show in an arrangement but wedging material (such as clear plastic wrap) can be used to hold specimens upright.
20. To allow the flowers to “condition”, cut and place immediately into water the evening before the show

**Design**

Design in the form or shape of the arrangement. To qualify as being of acceptable design the composition must possess unity, scale, and accent. A good design which pleases the eye contains balance, harmony, and rhythm. When choosing containers, the container should complement the flower design. Flower arranging is a serious art form. It should be enjoyed and bring much pleasure. **The name of the plants should be included on the entry tag where indicated.**
